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MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 4TH, 2017 IN BURNLEY TOWN HALL

Present: Counc, PG Osbaldeston, E. Ashworth, P. Marsden, C. Haworth and borough Coun. M. Brindle.

1. Apologies for absence

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2. Minutes of the last meeting

These were accepted.

3. Matters arising from minutes

3.1 Bull and Butcher

The clerk had asked the Burnley Express if it could re-submit publicity re the triangle project, but none had been forthcoming. BBC has agreed to provide lights for the Christmas tree. The lengthsman is to be asked to look at putting a small garden area on the piece of grass by the triangle. Once priced up, the clerk to try to secure ward opportunity funding from BBC.

3.2 Overhanging vegetation outside 320 Manchester Road

This has now gone.

3.3 Dog fouling in Helm Close

Councillors to check if the no dog fouling stickers have been put up.

3.3 Road surface between Rossendale Road and Rossendale Avenue

LCC say they are to action this.

3.4 Overhanging vegetation at the top of Moseley Road and Haworth Road

LCC are to action this.

4. Reports from outside bodies

Coun. PG Osbaldeston has put her name forward to speak at the planning inquiry. Coun. Brindle said the inspector will look at the sites on his own before the inquiry.

A police report had been sent in. Incidents recorded from August 1st to September 29th included: 10 – ASB's – five of which are an ongoing neighbour dispute, two from the industrial estate and others are isolated incidents.

One burglary in a dwelling in Oakeneaves Avenue, 12 burglaries on Farrington and Billington Road industrial estates, nine thefts from the Rossendale Road service station, four criminal damage from the industrial estate, one isolated incident on Crown Point Road and two vehicle crimes on the industrial estate and four other crimes.

PC Adam Gordon and his PSCO colleagues are working back from the neighbourhood office and there is now a response officer from each team who is tasked to cover the area in any downtime they may have and who are able to patrol if the regular officers are not available. The next PACT meeting is October 23rd at 6 pm. in Coal Clough Community Centre.

Coun. Osbaldeston had reported a suspicious man trying car doors in the early hours of the morning in Herkomer Avenue and residents have been advised to be vigilant.

5. Correspondence

Remembrance Day service details were given.

Details of the Department Communities and Local Government consultation on planning for right homes in the right places were received and passed to Coun. Osbaldeston.

6. Planning

APP/2017/0418 – bedroom extension at 50 Wilkie Avenue over garage and internal alterations – no objections.

APP/2017/0449 – proposed extension at 46 Oakeneaves Avenue to provide kitchen, dining area and study – no objections.

The planning agent for the Hambledon Hill wind farm extension said work has started on ordering and installing the extra turbines. Installation can take up to three years and so the community fund will not be in place until after then.
