JUNE UPDATE OF HABERGHAM EAVES PARISH COUNCIL DURING THE CORONAVIRUS LOCKDOWN. .

1 Updates

At the beginning of lockdown, the parish council organised a bag of essential shopping for over 80s in the parish who are on the Christmas calendar list. This was organised in conjunction with Burnley, Pendle and Rossendale CVS and was well received by those who received, a letter complementing the council was printed in the Local Press.

The planter bought using LCC Parish Council Champion grant funding has been delivered and placed in front of the boundary stone near the parish garden in Manchester Road and filled with seasonal plants. The clerk will maintain as the lengthsman does not want to take on extra work. A letter complementing the planter was printed in the Local Press.

Coun. Bill Brindle had applied for WOF funding for the parish council and a grant of £181 is to be given to the council towards an interpretation board for the new housing estate.

The clerk has been in discussion with LCC regarding the lack of grass cutting on the New Road. This has now been escalated to the head of highways. The clerk has organised for the planters and boundary stones to be trimmed around.

3 Correspondence

LCC public rights of way had written regarding the local delivery scheme and a grant of £500 towards work. It was agreed to apply for the funding.

The Campaign for the Protection of Rural England had published their thoughts on Burnley Council’s air quality and climate change strategy and the parish council endorsed their comments.

4. Planning

VAR/2020/0043 PROPOSAL: Application for removal of conditions 2 and 9 of planning application APP/2011/0112 to allow the property to be used as a permanent dwelling. (Condition 2 states 'The premises shall be used as holiday accommodation only and shall not be used as a person's sole or main place of residence' and condition 9 states 'If the building ceases to be used as a holiday let, it shall either be removed from the site and the land reinstated to its former condition within six months of its last use, or converted to stable use or other such use suitable to the rural area as may be approved in writing by the local planning authority'). AT: Brunanburh Olde Back Lane Burnley.
The parish council supports this application.

HOU/2020/0169 PROPOSAL: Proposed Conversion of Garage into Habitable Room and First Floor Extension above Garage AT: 41 Wilkie Avenue . No objections.

5. Meeting

Government legislation states that parish councils have to have a physical rather than virtual meeting. A proposed date of Wednesday, July 8th has been set, subject to Government restrictions. Still awaiting confirmation from the town hall to see if a meeting room is available.
