3. Matters arising from minutes

3.1 Bull and Butcher garden

Coun Brindle said the willow tree had come out of its strapping and needed to be put back. The clerk to contact Burnley parks and to also ask Slate Age to re look at the plinth as the paint appears to be coming off..

3.2 Fairways Drive ginnel

It was agreed to use the £500 from the Lancashire Delivery Scheme to tidy this up. Coun. Drain to liaise with the contractor.

3.3 Snack Van, Rossendale Road layby

3.4 Planter

The new planter on Manchester Road is looking colourful and is being tended by the clerk. The lengthsman has trimmed around the front and side of it. Once the flowers have died, it is planned to put heathers in.

The clerk is working with Nu Age to design and make an interpretation board using information from local historian, Ken Spencer.

3.6 Surplus water, Fairways Drive

Burnley Borough Council engineers are looking at the problem of water running from land behind the houses. All the affected house holders have been given recovery grants to try and help alleviate the problem.
