MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 4TH, 2020, VIA ZOOM

1. Apologies for absence

2. Minutes of the last meeting

These were accepted along with the updates sent during lockdown..

3. Matters arising from minutes

3.1 Bull and Butcher garden

The plinth has been checked and the mark is due to natural elements coming through. The tree has been strapped back, pansies have been planted and the grass cut. Coun. Osbaldeston said she was a little disappointed with the beech hedge.

3.2 Fairways Drive ginnel

The work has been done, but extra work was needed to make the path clean and clear up debris. This has now been done.

3.3 Snack Van, Rossendale Road layby

A new mobile snack van has appeared. Unsure if it is a temporary one, but the council will monitor and if permanent, will asked that the static one is removed.

3.4 Planter

Heathers are to be planted in the new planter.

3.5 Interpretation Board

The clerk is working with Pendle Signs to design and make an interpretation board using information from local historian, Ken Spencer.

3.6 Escape Road

This has now been auctioned off and allocated for housing.

3.7 Rossendale Avenue sign

A new sign has been ordered and should be up soon.

4. Reports from outside bodies

None. The clerk is to contact the police for monthly updates.

5. Correspondence

A letter of thanks was sent by Heidi Rose Marquis following the donation of £1,000 by the parish council towards the ongoing renovation of the Buttercross play area.

A national census is to take place next year and the parish council has been asked to publicise locally via the council website.

LCC has cut back the overgrown vegetation on Moseley Road.

Burnley Council's enforcement officer is investigating over alleged works on land behind 109 Glen View Road.

6. Planning

HOU/2020/0407 PROPOSAL: Proposed single storey extension AT: 41 Rossendale Avenue – no objections.

Burnley council has confirmed that the planned new industrial park on Rossendale Road will not affect the layby where the council planter and welcome sign are situated.

7. Finance

The council discussed the annual budget and precept and it was agreed to lower the precept this year in support of the community during the pandemic. The 2020/21 precept will be £6,337. The 2019/20 precept was for £6,684.

8. Any other business

Coun. Osbaldeston has bought calendars for the over 80's for the annual Christmas distribution.

The High Sheriff of Lancashire has recognized the work of the parish council during the March lockdown when food parcels were distributed to the needy and a new planter was provided to lift people's spirits. A certificate of merit has been presented to the parish council.
