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MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 1ST, 2021 IN BURNLEY GOLF CLUB.

Mr Ed Mountford was officially welcomed onto the parish council and signed the declaration of acceptance of office and received the official council starter pack.

1. Apologies for absence

2. Minutes of the last meeting

3. Matters arising from minutes

3.1 Bull and Butcher garden

The new care home is currently being built. An extra section of the entrance is to be given over to the parish garden. It will be owned by LCC, but maintained by the care home as part of the original garden.

3.2 Fairways Drive ginnel

The dog bin has not been replaced. Coun Inckle to chase up with BBC.

3.3 Buttercross play area

The lengthsman has been keeping this area tidy.

3.3 Wilkie Avenue flooding problems

LCC paid a repeat visit on September 14th and say the matter does not meet the required levels for work at this time.

3.4 Vegetation tipping on Moseley Road

The parish council is working with LCC to apply for funding for work to maintain and upgrade the area off Moseley Road, which will include access and repairs to make the area more accessible to multi users..A survey has been completed and the application is now in the next stage.

3.5 Vegetation around planters and boundary stones

The lengthsman has strimmed around and tidied up the area.

3.6 Pot holes and weeds in Wilkie Avenue

LCC has inspected and says the matter does not meet the required levels for work at this time. The sweeper makes regular visits to the area and BBC spray weeds every few months.

3.7 Woodplumpton Road dog bin

The request for a bin has been added to the list for the next financial year.

3.8 Flooding problems at Fairways Avenue

LCC say the request for a channel to be built would be the responsibility of the developer who built the estate.

3.9 Vegetation and road signage on Moseley Road

LCC has repainted the faded lines, the vegetation has been left to die back naturally.

3.9 (i) Dropped kerb and potholes at Oakeneaves Avenue

LCC has attended to these matters.

5. Correspondence

Prospect Homes who want to build at Hollins Cross had held an interactive consultation of 1,000 residents. The parish council objected when the land went into the Local Plan. An invitation for the developers to attend the meeting was sent, but they responded to say they would be happy to meet once the planning application is submitted.

The application for 101 houses on land south of Rossendale Road has been returned to the developer for amendments. The clerk to check progress.

Coun. Birtwistle gave an update on the former escape road which is subject to a re stocking plan for 178 trees.
