MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 4TH, 2024, IN BURNLEY GOLF CLUB.

Present: PG Osbaldeston, K. Haworth, M. Brindle, P Marsden, E. Mountford, PSCO Clark and one member of the public.

1. Apologies for absence

Couns Markarian and Drain.

2. Minutes of the last meeting

These were accepted.

3. Matters arising from minutes

3.1 Bull and Butcher garden

It was agreed to have an end of year weed organised of the garden and the planter opposite The Waggoners and at the Buttercross entrance.

3.2 Tipping at Micklehurst Farm

To ask Burnley and LCC for an update.

3.3 Parking problems at Apex Close

County Coun Hosker is dealing with this issue along with the police. To ask for an update from Coun Hosker as there is still a problem.

4. Reports from outside bodies

PSCO Clark had sent in recent crime reports. Coun Mountford asked about problems of farm animals getting onto the road at Crown Point as the fencing is down and whether the land owner had been asked to re fence. PSCO Clark said the main problem at Crown Point is speeding cars who use it as a race track.

PSCO Clark said currently there have been a spate of thefts of copper cable from industrial units. Security was becoming an issue on the industrial estates due to empty units and more being built in other areas of the parish.

5. Correspondence

An invitation to attend the Mayor's Charity Civic Ball for the cost of £45 per ticket was circulated to councillors.

Concern had been sent in by residents over bollards which have been built on the pavement half way up Rossendale Road on the left hand side and out into the road. People think it could cause problems and be a danger due to the two lanes. There is also concern re the new road workings opposite Airdrie Crescent.

BBC and LCC say the new access for the employment zone means a protected right turn into the site from Rossendale Road was required. They also say for much of the day there is some off street parking outside 292 to 336 Rossendale Road and in order to protect this, the bollards have been introduced. Once the development has finished, the site will be inspected to ensure compliance with the proposed design and findings of the safety audit which was carried out during the design process.

A request from a resident for a tidy up of the top of Manchester Road and the area around it of overgrown vegetation was passed to BBC's Streetscene who carried out the necessary work.

Residents had contacted the council over water supply problems caused by work at Hollins Cross Farm, this had been resolved by BBC working with the residents.

A request was received from Seddon Homes who are building a development off Rossendale Road, for the parish council to be act as communication between the developer and nearby residents during construction. It was agreed that the parish council is happy to pass on any concerns, but it is up to the developer and the planning authority to work together to resolve any issues.

BBC is to cut the grass in the ginnel at Fairways and also to convert the parish three tier planters to one tier for better displays.

Concern expressed that the new development at Woodplumpton Road will make matters worse. The clerk to contact BBC planning to ask what provisions for traffic have been made and to see if any solution can be found. PCSO Clark to forward a link which residents can fill in to express their concerns and any ideas for safety measures.

Coun PG Osbaldeston said a donation of £200 given to Burnley Golf Club to provide golf lessons for youngsters in a bid to tackle anti social behaviour had been well received and the sessions are well attended by local youngsters.
