MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 4TH, 2026 IN BURNLEY GOLF CLUB

Present:, Couns, C. Howarth, C. Markarian, P, Marsden, M Brindle and two representatives of Burnley Golf Club's junior academy.

1. Apologies for absence

Coun PG Osbaldeston, Drain, Mountford and PCSO Clarke.

2. Minutes of the last meeting

These were accepted.

3. Matters arising from minutes

3.1 Bull and Butcher garden

The parish gardener has tidied up the planters before the winter and planted up the new planter which has been placed opposite Woodplumpton Road.

3.2 Parking problems at Apex Close and road problems at Moseley Road

LCC had sent the following reply :

Arrange for the following alterations to the signs:

- From Rock Lane end – the existing 'horse and rider' warning sign on the street lighting column opposite Lower Timber Hill Lane will be moved to the opposite side just past the junction on its own post. A new 'series of bends' sign will be added to the same post with a plate indicating 'For 400 yards'.
- From Glen View Road end – a 'For 400 yards' plate will be added to the existing 'series of bends' sign just beyond the Prohibition of Driving and 20mph gateway.

With the existing 'horse and rider' signs, as well as bolstering the 'series of bends' signs so that they match on both approaches, feel that this is a reasonable adjustment at this time given the nature of the road. At any given location

there may be a number of warning signs placed that could be placed to warn drivers of possible hazards, and hazards should only be signed where they are most needed and will have the greatest effect. Believe the existing signs along with these amendments should provide drivers with enough information to navigate Moseley Road safely and at appropriate speeds, and any additional signs further to this would be significantly diminishing in benefit.

With regards to the request for yellow lines at the junction of Lower Timber Hill Lane, are still conducting visits to determine to identify a significant parking issue to warrant a Traffic Regulation Order. However, it is not likely this will be supported due to the excellent road safety history at this location. Furthermore, parking restrictions would have likely been a consideration in any highways comments for any of the previous developments, where the necessity for any additional parking restrictions should have already been identified.

4. Questions to the council

BBC has released a new grant fund via the government's Pride in Place programme, called the Pride in Place Impact Fund. Part of the fund is for rural communities and between £2,000 and £20,000 is available to the rural parishes for use in the community. Representatives from Burnley Golf Club's Junior Academy proposed a project to encourage juniors, especially from disadvantaged backgrounds. This is to follow on from the success of a current project which has attracted a large amount of juniors. The academy wants to build a new practice area and adapt the course to a blue course, to enable the project to grow. Councillors are fully supportive of the project and it was agreed that a funding application will be made.

PSCO Clarke reported a burglary on Wilkie Avenue, nothing taken, business break-in at The Summit on Manchester Road and items taken and cash stolen from a business on Manchester Road.
